The Impact of Large, Unrestricted Gifts on Nonprofits

Year 2 Nonprofit Interview Protocol

Introduction Script

Thank you again for taking time to talk with us today. Before we get started with the interview, we'd like to take a moment to introduce ourselves and provide some context for this conversation and our project.

As I said, I am [NAME], [POSITION] at CEP. Today's interview is a follow-up to last year's conversation, in which we're seeking to understand how your organization's experience as a recipient of a MacKenzie Scott grant has evolved since we last spoke. There are no "right or wrong answers" to the questions we'll be asking, and we are not looking for any particular responses — we'll simply be learning from you during this conversation.

Like last year's interview, this interview is confidential. We plan to record this conversation for transcription so that it can be analyzed accurately. With the exception of the CEP staff members working on this research project and the transcriber, all of whom have signed confidentiality agreements, no one else will have access to the recording and transcript of our interview. Do we have your permission to record?

This interview will take up no more than 60 minutes. We will not go past our allotted time, and you can stop the interview at any point if you so desire.

Great! Let's get started. We will hit record and you will hear an automated message.

IMPACTS OF THE GRANT

We'll start with the grant's impacts on your programmatic work and organization before turning to how it has impacted you personally as a leader.

Programmatic Impacts

- 1. Thinking about your programmatic work, what is the most important programmatic impact that your organization has been able to have on those it seeks to serve as a result of receiving this grant?

- 4. Has your organization added staff or otherwise grown—for example, in terms of capacity, internal specialization, or organizational complexity—because of this grant?

 - b. Is the organization experiencing any growing pains?
- 5. How, if at all, has your organization's internal culture or approach to internal equity shifted as a result of receiving this grant?
 - a. What has that meant for your leadership of the organization?
- 6. Once the Scott grant funds have been expended, how concerned are you about reaching a "financial cliff" that would force you to pull back on any new or expanded efforts?
 - a. What would you have to pull back on if you did reach this cliff?

Impacts on Leadership

- 7. (If you identify as a leader of color) We heard from many Scott grant recipients last year that receiving this grant was particularly meaningful for leaders of color. How has working with this grant over time shaped your experience as a nonprofit leader of color?
- 8. Has the grant influenced your thoughts on leadership succession?

Other Impacts

9. Has your organization experienced any unexpected negative consequences as a result of receiving this grant?

LEARNING

- 10. Given the amount of time your organization has had this grant, what lessons has your organization learned that you would encourage other nonprofits receiving a large, unrestricted grant to keep in mind?
- 11. We heard from many grant recipients last year that they hoped the impact of MacKenzie Scott's giving would motivate funders to put more trust in nonprofits. Is that happening in your experience with funders?
 - a. Reflecting on key aspects of the grant—the unrestricted funds, limited reporting requirements, and so on—there is a debate in philanthropy between those wishing to prioritize nonprofits' independence in similar ways and those seeking to use funder

expertise to decide how grant funds should be spent. When considering these perspectives, where do you fall and why?

PERCEPTIONS OF MACKENZIE SCOTT'S APPROACH

As you may be aware, MacKenzie Scott's gifts have been large, unrestricted grants that require minimal reporting.

- 2. What is your opinion on the approach to giving MacKenzie Scott has taken?
 - a. What, if anything, do you see as the greatest value of her approach?
 - b. Do you have any concerns about her approach? If yes, what concerns?
 - c. What do you hear from others (peers / donors) about her approach?
- 3. Community Foundation/United Way: Have donors been asking you questions about MacKenzie Scott's approach? If yes, what are the typical questions you're hearing?
- 4. CEO/Community Foundation/United Way: Has your board discussed MacKenzie Scott's giving at all?

Scott's giving has had a focus on funding organizations led by people of color and people with lived experience of the issues their organization seeks to affect.

- 5. Do you see MacKenzie Scott's approach to funding as playing a role in advancing equity? Why or why not?
- 6. How do considerations of equity fit, if at all, into your organization's decision-making about what type of support to provide?
- 7. The first couple years of her giving, Scott was making grants without solicitation. But as you may have heard, the newest phase of Scott's giving involves a call for applications. What are your thoughts on this shift in her grant making?

GRANTEE/DONOR RELATIONSHIPS

- 8. If you provide both unrestricted and restricted grants, how would you say your relationships with grantees differ, if at all, according to grant type?
- 9. In the last few years, have your grantees been asking for larger gifts? Fewer restrictions? Less reporting?
 - a. Have any of the grantees you interact with received a gift from MacKenzie Scott?If yes:
 - i. Has the relationship with these grantees changed since they received their gift from Scott? If so, how?
 - ii. Do you have any concerns about their ability to handle the gift they received from Scott?
 - iii. Have you changed your giving to those organizations at all? Do you plan to?
- 10. What is your overall impression of nonprofits' abilities to handle large, unrestricted grants?

FOUNDATION/FUNDER ROLES

As we have already touched on, there has been increasing advocacy around practices like unrestricted gifts and minimal reporting that are seen as aligning with trust-based philanthropy, but not all funders have interest in that approach. Some funders believe there is great value in using their organization's expertise to guide how nonprofits should use funding.

- 11. When considering these perspectives, what do you believe your foundation/organizations' approach should be?
- 12. If unrestricted grants with minimal reporting became much more common in the field, what would you see as the benefits? What would be the challenges?
 - a. What would be the change in the nonprofit sector more broadly?
 - b. Independent Foundation CEO/PO: What role do you think program officers would play if patterns of giving shifted?
